In his book Six Amazing Bible Stories to Strangely Warm Our Hearts, James W. Moore told about retired public school teacher who, on her eightieth birthday, was given a reception in her honor by several of her former students. Most of those who gathered around her that afternoon credited her with being one of, or the single, most influential person in their lives.

What is amazing about the story is that when the woman began her teaching career, she was assigned to one of the toughest schools that the city of Boston has ever known. The drop-out rate was phenomenal and violence, both in and around the school, was an everyday occurrence.

But then something happened – something that no one ever expected. Students who were once considered incorrigible began to show signs of improvement. Their behavior and their attitudes began to change. Those who were once flunking every subject began showing signs of some academic promise. There were even a few who, in place of looking forward to dropping out, began talking about attending college or trade school.

And what did all of these students have in common? They had all been students of the same incredibly dedicated teacher. While not everyone who had the privilege of being in her classroom went on to become highly successful adults, many of them did go on to accomplish amazing things. Some of those who gathered around her that day were now doctors, lawyers, political leaders, teachers, professors, social workers and economists. Not bad for a group of kids who had been labeled as failures by everyone **except** a very naïve and inexperienced teacher who refused to give up on them!

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm

Ultrasound is used to screen for the existence of an aneurysm (enlargement) in the abdominal aorta that could lead to a ruptured aortic artery.

Atrial Fibrillation

A quick and easy test using EKG electrodes placed on the arms and legs to identify the presence of an irregular heartbeat at the time of screening. Atrial fibrillation increases the risk of stroke by 5 times.

Osteoporosis Risk

An ultrasound measurement of the heel bone to determine abnormal bone mass density.
