FRETSA UPDATE

Last newsletter I wrote that this issue would give more details about FRETSA (Franklin County Emergency Temporary Shelter) and how it works...so here goes:

FRETSA is the only group which works with the core problem of homelessness: budgeting and saving. None of our funding goes for utilities, food, gas, or motel rooms...all needed items by the homeless, but none of which address the "how they got there in the first place", and all are items which can be obtained from other sources.

FRETSA does have a small amount donated by Cornerstone Church for motel use IF the family has applied, looks to be a good fit for our program by Board decision, but the background check has not been returned so that a final decision can be made.

The parameters of the FRETSA program are simple: the applicant family must be working, must be willing to abide by the strict rules of the application process (no smoking inside the units, or where smoke can enter the building), no pets, no allowing others to live with them, have goals set for entry back into regular housing, following a set budget (Dave Ramsey "envelope" plan, set up with a caseworker), track all expenditures, allowing the caseworker to check receipts, income stubs, and show a savings plan, and participate in all ECKAN benefit programs. Most important: absolutely no drugs. FRETSA gives no tolerance: one incident and the resident family is out...right then.

Yes, this is a labor intensive work, and it is where we could use more volunteers. We could use people to make the weekly home visit, under the supervision of a certified caseworker, to check receipts, budgeting compliance, and other items the caseworker might suggest. It does not require much time... just the willingness to help others with Christ's love and compassion.

There are also other needs that FRETSA has. The second unit, Palmer House, needs shelving in the kitchen cabinets...nothing fancy, but a cupboard with a four foot span isn't very usable. Also we need either some brick pavers or concrete blocks to extend from the front steps outward. There is a bad "swag" (read swimming pool!) in front of the storage shed, but we have hopes of getting that fixed by the park owners. Roseberry House needs the siding cleaned; the park owners have a power washer that can be borrowed, but if we have a mother and children as residents, we need manpower to do the job.

And, as with all houses, the list goes on and on. Always we can use paper goods, laundry products, and other items which allow us to keep our budget money for rent and utilities.

FRETSA is an important part of the FUMC missions, and as the quarterly FRETSA Sundays come around, we hope you will remember to give generously to this worthy cause.


UMW CIRCLES
