Dear Friends,

Walking the dogs this past week has been anything but fun! It seems as though every mother bird in a six block radius of our house has decided it was time to push their babies out of the nests. As a result every time I have taken the dogs out, they have managed to flush out at least one already traumatized bird. The moment they find the baby, there are several adult birds who begin cawing and dive-bombing us. In the midst of all the confusion, I am the one who gets hopelessly tangled in the leashes. Have you ever tried to control two excited dogs who are certain their new best friend is getting away while trying to protect one's body from a flock of angry birds? It may be exciting but it certainly isn't fun!

I watched the progress of one particular bird over the course of two days. It seemed to be having more difficulty learning to fly than its nest mates. While two of them hopped around the yard most of the morning and cried for help, by midafternoon they were fluttering from one bush to another with little supervision from the older birds. The third one, however, seemed to become more distressed as the day wore on. It refused to do anything but hop from one hiding place to another. When the other two began to flutter, this one ran behind them crying even louder. All the while the older birds were circling above it in an attempt to keep it safe from predators and other natural hazards.

As I watched from the kitchen window as this whole scene unfolded, I began to wonder how often those of us within the church are like that reluctant bird. While God has given us everything we need to fly, we refuse to spread our wings! The Holy Spirit not only surrounds us with words of encouragement but is also willing to show us how to complete those tasks we have been asked to perform. Yet, despite all of this, we are allowing our fears of the unknown to stop us from even trying.

Like the bird, we need to learn that God will not ask us to attempt anything we are incapable of doing. If only we listen . . . if only we trust and follow . . . the future will be filled with joys and accomplishments we never dreamed were possible.

Congratulations! We did it! For the second year in a row we paid one hundred percent of Mission Shares, World Service and Conference Benevolences. While these are often considered an unfair tax on the local congregation, the truth is that by combining our financial resources with other United Methodists throughout the country we are able to accomplish more ministry in more places than we could ever do on our own. The World Service Fund underwrites our mission program that reaches around the world. It empowers the United Methodist evangelistic effort that spreads the Good News of Jesus Christ into communities that have not yet heard or responded. This money is also used to support such programs as the Ministerial Education Fund so those who have been called by God to serve within the church can receive the monetary assistance that makes a seminary education possible.

But your generosity has done more than support these world-wide efforts of our denomination. Because you give, children and youth are going to camp where their lives will be touched by the love of Christ. Women who are attempting to escape from domestic abuse have a safe place to shower and clean up. Those who have suffered personal losses such as death and divorce are able to get the emotional and spiritual support they need to rebuild their lives. Narcotics Anonymous provides the same support to individuals who are recovering from the effects of drug abuse. We also support one of the most active Boy Scout troops in the area. Then there is the support we give to Hope House; the

outreach to children and adults through the shared Awana program; and all of the programming we provide to our own members so we can continue to grow in our spiritual lives.

All of this is made possible through your prayers, your participation and your financial giving. While we continue to make plans that will increase our outreach programs and expand such areas as our children and youth ministries. we are also realistic. At the current time our budget is falling short by about \$1,500 per week. As we enter into the summer months there is concern about meeting our financial obligations. With that said, we also know that the people of Ottawa First United Methodist Church are committed to being a vital witness in our community and in the world. So as you make plans for all the special activities that occur during this time of year, please remember to include the church in your prayers and in your giving. With a little effort on everyone's part we can, and we will, meet our financial obligations while strengthening our ministries in the months to come.

THE WAY FORWARD

This is an important time for The United Methodist Church. At the 2016 General Conference the Council of Bishops appointed a task force composed of delegates throughout the world to develop a proposal concerning the denominational stance on issues surrounding the possible ordination of homosexuals and the ability for clergy to perform same-sex marriages. That task force has now completed its work and presented its recommendations to the Council of Bishops. A special General Conference has been called for 2019 so that the elected delegates from every United Methodist Conference can vote on those recommendations.

In the months leading up to that special Conference, our Bishop will be hosting a series of listening events. He plans on hosting one event in every district throughout the Great Plains Conference. In preparation for those listening events it is important that every local congregation become informed about the suggested proposals and the effects they will have on our denomination as a whole.

In an effort to help our congregation in this process, several different activities will be offered. First, it is important to understand the spiritual principles that guide our decision making process. On July 8th, Pastor Kathleen will begin a three part sermon series based on the late Bishop Ruben Jones' book The Three Simple Rules. Secondly, an intergenerational Sunday school class entitled The Wesleyan Way will be offered during that same time frame. Pastor Kathleen will help us explore the basic

beliefs of United Methodists. Thirdly, in early August there will be a time to gather and explore the proposals that will be voted on at the 2019 General Conference. This step will prepare us for the Five Rivers District Listening Event with Bishop Ruben Saenz.

April Blood Drive and Award

Ottawa First was given an award as a "Top Organization for 2017" by the Community Blood Center for our three blood drives during 2017. Ruth Jansen, Celia Davis, and Sue Petersen attended the Community Blood Center Topeka Recognition Luncheon on May 3rd. We were recognized for our participation for the past 15 years, and also for increasing our number of units collected.

At our most recent blood drive April 25th, the CBC staff registered 42 volunteers, and collected 42 units of blood. Since each unit can be used to help 3 people by giving red blood cells, platelets, or plasma, we potentially helped 126 people at this drive alone. This was our 30th drive at FUMC. It should be noted that although 1 in 7 people will need blood during their lifetime, only 1 in 20 people donate. To enlist donors our Mission Committee members make between 200 and 300 phone calls per drive. We would like to sincerely thank all who donated or helped with the drive.
