Dear Friends,

In his book, The Prodigal Prophet, Rev. Timothy Keller recalls a fairy tale he read several years ago about a wicked witch who lived in a cottage deep within a forest. When travelers passed by looking for lodging, she offered them a meal and a bed. It was the most comfortable bed anyone had ever felt. It was also a bed full of dark magic, and if a person were sleeping in it when the sun came up, he or she would turn into stone, making one a figure in the witch's statutory until the end of time. Now this witch had forced a young girl to become her servant. While the girl had no power to resist the witch, she had become increasingly sorry for her victims. One day a young man came looking for a night's lodging. The servant girl couldn't bear to see him turned into stone. So she threw sticks, rocks and thistles into his bed making it horribly uncomfortable. Everytime he turned over or moved in any direction, he felt a new painful object under him. Though he cast each one upon the floor, there was always a new one to dig into him. Unable to sleep, he finally rose long before dawn and prepared to leave. As he walked out the front door, the servant girl met him, and he berated her saying, How could you give a traveler such a terrible bed? What kind of a person are you who would treat another so badly? As he went on his way, she whispered under her breath, Ah, the misery you know now is nothing

like the greater misery a comfortable sleep would have brought upon you. Those were my sticks and stones of love. As I reflect over the events of the past two weeks - as I hear the sorrow, hurt and even anger that many of you have expressed - I cannot help but wonder if God has brought us to this place, not as punishment, but as an act of love. The uncomfortable feelings we have as we face a new, uncertain future can either defeat us or awaken us to new possibilities. Perhaps we have become too comfortable. Maybe we had been lulled into a false sense of security. Or could it be we are simply afraid to reach out - to take those first steps that will lead us into a deeper commitment to serve and love those outside the church? As Rev. Keller points out, God puts sticks and stones of love in our beds to wake us up, to bring us to rely on him, lest the end of history or life overtake us without the Lord in our hearts, and we be turned to stone. Indeed, the Bible speaks of salvation like this. "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh." (Ezekiel 36:26). While it is disappointing that I will not be a part of whatever future God is calling Ottawa First to embrace, I am also excited that you are being called to embrace a new spirit . . . a new ministry. As we begin this Lenten Season, I encourage all of you to join me in prayer as we discern where we are being called to go and serve. Christ is with us and through him all things are possible!

### **FRETSA**

FRETSA is busy as always; both homes are occupied, and we have the usual backlog of applicants. The need does not grow less...it seems that we see more and more families who are living marginally, going from relative to relative to find a place to sleep for even a few nights. With weather like we've been seeing, sleeping in a car is not an option, and Ottawa Communities in Schools tells us they have documented 192 homeless/at risk students in just Ottawa alone, not counting the other schools in the county.

FRETSA reminds the church that it is almost time for another quarterly "FRETSA SUNDAY". This will be the designated Sunday to give help to FRETSA; please put cash donations in an envelope marked "FRETSA" or make the notation on your check. If the weather cooperates, we are looking at March 10 as the date...but that will remain to be seen!

This is the time of year when grants for funding are being written, and fundraising is in full swing. Our thanks goes to the FUMC foundation committee for their support ...which was one stipulation Eileen Roseberry made when she left a portion of her estate for the homeless. She wanted her church involved, and you all are to be commended as you step up, both as a church and as individuals, to carry out her wishes.

This is how the church becomes involved in a community, and each of us should proudly carry the FUMC banner out into the streets, just as Christ commanded us to; as He put it, "Those who are well do not need a doctor; I came to heal those who are sick..." And you, in helping with FRETSA, are supporting a very sick population; poverty is a terrible thing to behold.
